The Informed and Linked Care for Seniors (InfoLinCS) research program fosters innovative approaches to chronic disease prevention and management and strives to improve access to care for vulnerable Canadian populations. InfoRehab is a CIHR-funded research program aimed at enhancing musculoskeletal rehabilitation through more effective use of health information. interRAI research promotes evidence-based clinical practice and policy decisions through high quality data about characteristics and outcomes of persons served across a variety of health and social services settings.

InfoRehab est un programme de recherche financé par les IRSC qui vise à améliorer la rééducation musculosquelettique par une utilisation plus efficace de l'information de santé. Les recherches d'interRAI visent à promouvoir des pratiques cliniques et des décisions stratégiques fondées sur des données probantes par l'intermédiaire de données de haute qualité sur les caractéristiques et les résultats de personnes recevant divers services sanitaires et sociaux dans différents contextes.
